


Nagoya Castle, one of Japan's Three Most Famous Castles, and last effort for country unification under Tokugawa Ieyasu. And after 10 years of restoration works, the gorgeous palace opened to the public in its entirety!

Atsuta Jingu Shrine - One of Japan's Three Most Important shrines, guarding the God-given sword.

The Tokugawa Art Museum - The clan's sumptuous hall, including a scroll of Japan's oldest novel "The Tale of Genji", a designated National Treasure.

Japan Heritage Arimatsu Narumi traditional town - See and experience the traditional art of tie-dying in the nostalgic area of Arimatsu, a designated National Treasure.

Horikake Garden - Opened on the 100th anniversary of ceramics maker Noritake Co., Limited, enjoy painting workshops, and shopping.

Higashiyama Zoo & Botanical Gardens - Meet charismatic Shabani, the world's most handsome western lowland gorilla, and visit an astoundingly vast garden!

Chubu Electric Power Mirai Tower & Hisaya-odori Park - A renewed park and shopping space! A symbol of Nagoya and a designated Tangible Cultural Property. The TV Tower was renamed Chubu Electric MIRAI TOWER in May 2021.

Oasis 21 - Spaceship Aqua, a futuristic glass rooftop with a reflecting pool. Below it, a tourist information center, an event space, and lots of shops.

LEGOLAND® Japan - The Lego® Blocks outdoor kids theme park arrived in Japan. Featuring eight areas with over 40 attractions and shows that the whole family can enjoy!

Nagoya City Science Museum - Home to one of the world's largest planetariums, it's a fascinating place of science and fun!

1 National Treasure Inuyama Castle H1
See the stunning sight of the land with Kisagawa River as backdrop, from Japan's OLDEST extant castle, an enduring proof of architectural mastery.

2 Aichi Museum of Flight H2
Many rare aircraft on display, starting with the YS-11, Japan's first passenger plane. Try becoming a pilot or mechanic, or join a hands-on program at the Science Lab.

3 The Museum Meiji Mura H1
Step back in time to the Meiji period at this open-air museum featuring over 60 carefully dismantled, moved, and rebuilt structures.

4 Toyota Automobile Museum H3
About 140 rare cars tell the history since the dawn of gasoline-powered vehicles. There's also an automobile Culture Showroom with some 4,000 items on display.

5 Ama City Shippo Art Village H3
Almost two centuries of "Shippo-yaki" cloisonné history gathered in a museum where you can see the work of skilled artisans and uttermy important pieces of art.

6 Hatsumi Shrine G3
Over 1,450 years of a history featuring the most famous samurai and one of Japan's three major river festivals, Tanno Matsuri, featuring gorgeously decorated boats.

7 Kiyosu Castle H2
A great reconstruction of local warlord and hero Oda Nobunaga's castle, where visitors can get to know the history of the city during the Sengoku period.

8 Tsushima Shrine G3
In the famous pottery city of Seto, see Japan's largest beeking cat museum, displaying statues collected from throughout Japan and offering experiential, hands-on activities.

9 Maneki-Neko Museum J2
In the famous pottery city of Seto, see Japan's largest beeking cat museum, displaying statues collected from throughout Japan and offering experiential, hands-on activities.

10 Chita Peninsula
Embraced by the rich waters of both Lake Biwa and Mikawa bays, Chita Peninsula is a cornucopia of sea produce that provides a large part of Aichi's incredible marine menu. Traditional industry encompassing ceramics and breweries also a delightful experience.

11 Himakajima and Shinojima Islands I7
Coastal islands where nature is strong, and renowned for their sea produce, like octopus "tako" and the pufffish "fugu".

12 Mizkan Museum (MIM) H5
Themed on "jozo", the culture of brewed food, you'll learn the history and culture of vinegar and other Aichi staple foods and how it shaped the area's history through time.

13 Tokoname Pottery Footpath H5
Paved with countless ceramic items fired at the area's historically important kilns, this hiking path will lead you to the gigantic "maneki-neko" beeking cat!


14 Handa Red Brick Building H5
Once a beer brewery, this German-style building is an important cultural asset where a locally brewed beer is still served and various events held year-round.

15 Minamichita Flower Park "Kanko Noen Rana Hiroba" H7
Walk to the middle of a massive field of ever blooming flowers and be amazed by the wonderful sight of them completely filling your view!

16 Honen Festival of Tagata Shrine H2
Wildly popular among overseas tourists, a two-meter long male figure carved in wood is paraded around on a portable shrine, a ritual with ancient roots.

17 Toyohama Sea Beam "Tai" Festival H7
Giant sea beam shrimps are paraded around town, then they enter the ocean. Impressive festival by men of the sea.

18 Kariya Mando Festival I4
Large paper lanterns are carried by one person. The lanterns dance around amidst taiko drumming and festival music.

FESTIVALS in AICHI

Passionate festival folks perpetuating our traditional culture! Enjoy the traditional culture of Aichi by witnessing the people fervently carrying on these traditions, a custom recognized by the inclusion, in 2016, of five festival activities in the "Yama, Hoko, and Yatai Fesu" festival registration at the UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage.

- Floats of Inuyama Festival** H1: Held since the Edo Period, this festival features karakuri mechanical puppets dancing on the floats. The highlights are the "Donden" float, the turning and the evening parade of floats festooned with paper lanterns. Inuyama-City. First Sat. in Apr. Pre-Festival; Next Day: Main Festival. *0568-61-6000 (Inuyama Tourist Information Center)
- Bunraku and Karakuri Floats of Chiryu Festival** I4: The floats are highlighted by Bunraku puppet plays and Karakuri mechanical puppet plays. Chiryu-City. Pre-Festival: May 2; Festival: May 3. *0568-63-1111
- Floats of Kamezaki Shiohi Festival** I5: Five floats with gorgeous puppets and fine sculptures are paraded around the ocean at low tide with great fanfare. Handa-City. Pre-Festival: May 3; Festival: May 4 (national holidays). *0569-28-0019
- Danjiribune Boats of Owari-Tsushima Tanno Festival** G5: One of Japan's Big Three river festivals. The festival is with beautiful boats cruising down Tanno River was also favored by Lord Oda Nobunaga. Tsushima-City and Aisei-City. Fourth Sat. in Jul. and the next day. *0567-96-3216
- Danjiribune Boat and Myoshi-Nagashi of Sunari Festival** G3: This festival originates from the Tanno religion and features the elegant boat floats on the river and the sacred rice floating. Kariya-City. First weekend in Aug. *0567-95-1111

 - 1 Honen Festival of Tagata Shrine** H2: Widely popular among overseas tourists, a two-meter long male figure carved in wood is paraded around on a portable shrine, a ritual with ancient roots. Inuyama-City. Jan. 1 to 3. *0569-24-1111
 - 2 Toyohama Sea Beam "Tai" Festival** H7: Giant sea beam shrimps are paraded around town, then they enter the ocean. Impressive festival by men of the sea. Minamichita-City. Mar. 15. *0569-62-3100
 - 3 Kariya Mando Festival** I4: Large paper lanterns are carried by one person. The lanterns dance around amidst taiko drumming and festival music. Kariya-City. Third Sat. in Jul. and the next day. *0568-76-2906
 - 4 Mikawa Isshiki Lantern Festival** I6: A festival with a history dating back 450 years. Six pairs of giant paper lanterns six to ten meters long decorate the summer night sky. Nishio-City. Sat. and Sun. of the next day. *0563-73-4276
 - 5 Hand-Held Cannon Fireworks "Tezutsu Hanabi"** K6: The famous fireworks of Higashi-Mikawa, an impressive display of courage and fire that holds in multiple locations from late Jul. to Oct. Toyohashi, Toyokawa and other cities. *0568-23-4100
 - 6 Miya Festival** K6: Four gorgeous floats are paraded around town, then they are carried into the ocean. Gamagori-City. First Sat. in Oct. *0533-68-2526
 - 7 Hana Festivals** M4: Okumikawa Region's sacred performing art with a history of over 700 years. Townsfolk dressed as ogre dance all night. Chita-City, Toe-cho and Toyone-mura. *0532-41-2185
 - 8 Konomiya Naked Festival "Hadaka Matsuri"** H2: In the cold of winter, thousands of men in loincloths fearfully jostle to touch the Sacred Man and dispel bad luck. Hamaoka-City. 25th Day of the Lunar New Year (Feb. or Mar.). *0587-22-1414

 - 1 Obari Shikizakura Winter Cherry Blossoms** J3: Cherry blossoms: early Apr. and early to mid-Nov. autumn leaves: Oct. to Dec. Best time to see both: early to late Nov. Obari-City. *0565-45-3808
 - 2 Okazaki Castle** J5: Deemed as birthplace of hero Tokugawa Ieyasu, it saw much conflict but now is a museum and home to fair cherry trees. Okazaki-City. 9:00 to 17:00 (last admission 16:30). *Please contact for operator.
 - 3 Matcha Museum Saijeon Waku Waku** J5: Special experiential programs only a green tea factory can offer! Try tea tasting, learn about tea evaluation and shop for delicious tea-related souvenirs. Yatsuya-City. From 10:00, 13:00, 15:00. Under reservation only (via web or phone). First Thu. of every month and New Year (Jan. 1). *1,000 (ages 3 and older). *0563-77-6572 (Tour Reservations). *Enter via side from Nishio Station (Mellettsu Nishio Line).
 - 4 Kariya Highway Oasis** I4: A unique road stop that has it all: amusement park, "onsen" hot springs, delicious food, shops and more. Even the exquisite and beautiful toilets are worth a look! Kariya-City. Open 24/7 (very depending on facility). Some uncheckered days off. *Subject to changes depending on the time of year. *Some uncheckered days off. *Free of charge (some facilities require fee). *0566-35-0211
 - 5 Yotsuya Senmadai Thousand Rice Paddies** M4: Impressive feats of landscaping, the ancient terraced paddy field that blooms in late spring becoming a fascinating sight and the highest such garden in Japan. Yotsuya-City. 20-185 Goshodaira, Sakakaba, Toyone-mura. Some uncheckered days off. *Fees vary depending on the activity. *0536-87-2545
 - 6 Toyokawa Inari Shrine & Temple** K6: One of the three most important Inari Shrines of Japan, this sacred place is guarded by an overwhelming count of white fox statues and other impressive constructions. Toyokawa-City. 0533-32-0022
 - 7 Irago Cape Lighthouse** I8: One of Japan's top 50 must-see beacons and oldest in Aichi, it sits at the vast entrance to Mikawa Bay and is one of the most famous "lover's sanctuaries". Irago-City. 0531-20-3516

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WEST MIKAWA
Birthplace of Hero Tokugawa Ieyasu, this is a romantic place where samurai flowed and great historic events took place. Also home to the famous soy paste Fatcho Miso and the nostalgic town of its origin!

1 Obari Shikizakura Winter Cherry Blossoms J3
Spring cherry blossoms are beautiful. Maple trees in autumn, dreamy. See BOTH in this rare natural spectacle, while exploring the ancient art of Wachi Japanese paper.

2 Okazaki Castle J5
Deemed as birthplace of hero Tokugawa Ieyasu, it saw much conflict but now is a museum and home to fair cherry trees.

3 Matcha Museum Saijeon Waku Waku J5
Special experiential programs only a green tea factory can offer! Try tea tasting, learn about tea evaluation and shop for delicious tea-related souvenirs.

4 Kariya Highway Oasis I4
A unique road stop that has it all: amusement park, "onsen" hot springs, delicious food, shops and more. Even the exquisite and beautiful toilets are worth a look!

5 Yotsuya Senmadai Thousand Rice Paddies M4
Impressive feats of landscaping, the ancient terraced paddy field that blooms in late spring becoming a fascinating sight and the highest such garden in Japan.

6 Toyokawa Inari Shrine & Temple K6

One of Japan's top 50 must-see beacons and oldest in Aichi, it sits at the vast entrance to Mikawa Bay and is one of the most famous "lover's sanctuaries".



EAST MIKAWA
Warm climate and the unique culture of Asumi Peninsula and its people both reinforce the great power of nature permeating this blessed area. Perfect for enjoying outdoor settings and delicious food!

1 Laguna Ten Bosch K6
This sea-themed park is a must for your Aichi visit, with a huge mall, family attractions, and six pool areas that open in the summer.

2 Mt. Chausuyama M3
The plateau of Aichi's tallest peak has a 2.2 hectares' phoenix field that blooms in late spring becoming a fascinating sight and the highest such garden in Japan.

3 Gamagori Orange Park J6
Enjoy seasonal fruit such as orange and strawberry picking any time of year. Grape and melon seasons also popular.

4 Toyohashi Zoo & Botanical Park "Non-hoi Park" L7
A rare facility even in Japan: amusement, botanical and zoo park, plus museum! Watch the polar bear's powerful dive up close for enhanced excitement.

5 Yotsuya Senmadai Thousand Rice Paddies M4
Impressive feats of landscaping, the ancient terraced paddy field that blooms in late spring becoming a fascinating sight and the highest such garden in Japan.

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
