



Cherry blossoms and other colorful flowers in full bloom

This season is popular, particularly among tourists, because of its warm, mild climate. Aichi Prefecture has many famous flower spots, including cherry blossoms symbolizing Japan's spring, creeping phlox spreading like a carpet on the ground, and wisteria flowers elegantly hanging down.

In autumn, you can fully relish the atmosphere of Japan through vibrant red foliage covering ravines, mountain villages tinted in light pink with *Shikizakura* (four-season cherry blossoms), local trains running through tunnels of golden gingkoes, etc. This season is also perfect for strolling around because of the cool, comfortable weather.








A wealth of experiences through nature that allows you to feel the Japanese summer

With both seas and mountains, Aichi Prefecture is characterized by nature in various forms. You can visit remote islands on a boat or see countryside scenery reminiscent of old folklore tales in the mountains. Also, fireworks festivals bustling with people in yukata (kimono for summer) enable you to feel Japan's traditional summer.









Encounters with dramatic scenery and culture

You can enjoy mysterious landscapes unique to this season, such as a frozen waterfall seen in the cold season and a traditional Japanese Shinto ritual where goblins appear. In the area of the Atsumi Peninsula with its warm and mild climate, you can feel the spring early with rapeseed blossoms in full bloom on the roadsides.

Nagoya Castle and Hommaru Palace

This castle was built by Japan's leading warlord, leyasu Tokugawa. The opulent and magnificent Hommaru Palace and dance performances by Bushotai (a band of samurai generals) are also must-see sights. At KINSHACHI-YOKOCHO spreading out below the castle, you can enjoy Nagoya's













With Japan's oldest existing castle tower, this castle is designated as a national treasure. On the top balcony, you can enjoy a fine view, feeling as if you were a feudal lord.



Atsuta Jingu Shrine -Nagoya City-

This shrine with its long history stands amid a forest alive with myths. Enshrined here is the Sacred Kusanagi no Mitsurugi, one of the Three Imperial Regalia of Japan.



Shirotori Garden -Nagoya City-

This garden is one of the largest Japanese gardens in the Chubu region, which provides the changing scenery of the four seasons, such as seasonal flowers, autumn foliage, and giant trees with branches held up by intricate ropes.

UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage, "Yama, Hoko, and Yatai Float Festivals" Aichi's Floats Festivals

These are a collection of Japan's traditional festivals recognized as a UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage. With decorated floats slowly advancing in towns or on rivers, you can enjoy artistic and exquisite decorations and Karakuri (mechanical) dolls.





Tezutsu Fireworks -Toyohashi City and other areas-

This is an event in which you can enjoy a variety of traditional tezutsu hanabi (hand-held fireworks) and other fireworks. You will be overwhelmed by a magnificent and valiant scene in which craftsmen project fireworks from hand-held firework tubes filled with gun powder while being showered with sparks!

Handa Red Brick Building -Handa City-

Hitsumabushi

This is Aichi's representative local cuisine, which is eaten in three ways: The first serving of rice topped with grilled eel is eaten as is, the second serving is eaten with condiments, and the third serving is eaten like ochazuke (tea-infused rice) with broth pored over the eel and rice.

Miso-katsu

This is a crisp pork cutlet with rich miso sauce poured over it.





Tenmusu

This is a small-sized rice ball with deep-fried shrimp, which goes remarkably well with rice.





Tebasaki Chicken Wings

These are deep-fried chicken wing tips with their spicy, sweet taste making the dish perfect with beer.





Toyokawa Inari Sushi

This is a type of sushi with rice stuffed inside deep-fried tofu pouches, using a variety of materials.









Hatcho Miso

This is a miso unique to Aichi, made in a lengthy process in which only soy beans and salt are used and fermented in wooden vats. Even the famous warlord, leyasu Tokunaga, is said to have liked

Nishio City is one of Japan's major matcha producers. You can try grinding tea leaves with a millstone and enjoy Japanese sweets using matcha.

The Nagoya Japanese Sword Museum "Nagoya Touken World" -Nagoya City-




This museum exhibits swords that are highly valuable not only as weapons but also as works of art. You can also view armor, Ukiyo-e, matchlock guns, and antique West-




The area is home to various commercial facilities, such as Nagoya Parco, which offers a wide selection of anime goods, and the popular photo spot, Oasis 21.


